MOMENT IN HISTORY

Fall 1995 marked a five-year losing streak against rival Texas A&M. Following a 31-6 blowout at Jones AT&T Stadium two years prior, Texas Tech was set to host A&M at home during Zach Thomas's final season as a Red Raider. Late in the fourth quarter,

51,205 Red Raider fans watched as A&M had the ball with 30 seconds on the clock. A&M QB Corey Puling's pass was intercepted by Thomas at the 25-yard line in one of the most memorable plays in Texas Tech program history. Thomas ran down the sideline towards the end zone ending the game with a 14-7 victory and ending the five-year losing streak against Texas A&M. DR. CHUCK ALEXANDER

TEXAS TECH FOOTBALL 1980-1984

FROM DEFENSIVE BACK TO INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN ORTHODONTIST

Chuck Alexander played defensive back as part of the Texas Tech Football program from 1980-1984. During his time at Texas Tech he earned Academic All-American accolades and the Donny Anderson Sportsmanship Award. After earning his bachelor's degree during his time at Texas Tech, Chuck went on to obtain his D.D.S. from Baylor College of Dentistry in Dallas and his M.S.D. from the University of Washington, Seattle. Early on in his career, Dr. Chuck Alexander was awarded the 1995 C.T. Rowland Award for outstanding clinical treatment. Along with being a practicing orthodontist, Dr. Alexander has lectured across several states, as well as in Germany, Turkey, Mexico, Canada and Russia. He is also an active member of the

American Association of Orthodontists, a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, and has published many articles in orthodontic journals. Orthodontics runs deep in the Alexander family. Chuck followed in the orthodontic footsteps of his father and alongside his brother and cousin. Together, the Alexander Family is leading an orthodontic movement: The Alexander Discipline. Founded by Dr. Chuck's father, The Alexander Discipline is an organization that was created on the principles developed over his 50 years of orthodontic practice. Orthodontists all over the world follow the principles and teachings of the Alexander Discipline. Dr. Chuck, with his orthodontic brother and cousin, continue to refine and improve the Alexander Discipline and carry the principles into the future of orthodontics. Dr. Chuck Alexander and his brother currently resides in Montrose, Colorado. Dr. Chuck's practice, Alexander Orthodontics, has locations in Montrose, Gunnison, and Telluride, Colorado. As well as being a practicing orthodontist and a partner of the Alexander Discipline, Dr. Chuck also is a part-time Clinical Instructor at Colorado University Health Science Center in the Orthodontic Graduate Department.
