
TEXAS TECH ATHLETICS

The Scovell family have many ties to Texas Tech University. Including the fact that John, along with his three sons, are all football Letter Winners at Texas Tech. John Scovell was a football letter winner from 1965-1967 and graduated with an Accounting degree from Texas Tech in 1968. He later earned his MBA from Harvard Business School and became the co-founder, past CEO/president, and current chairmen of Woodbine Development which has championed several commercial real-estate projects in Dallas including the Hyatt Regency. Later, John's three sons, Field, King, and Durpee would continue in their father's footsteps and would each play football and earn their undergraduate degrees at Texas Tech. Field Scovell, the oldest, was a football letter winner from 1994-1996. He attended medical school at Texas Tech and completed his residency at UT Southwestern and Parkland Hospital. Field and his wife Lyle currently live in Dallas and they have three children, John Field, Maren, and Campbell. King Scovell was a football letter winner from 1998-2001. He graduated in 2001 with a finance degree from the Rawls College of Business. He is the chief development officer of Woodbine Development, serves as the co-chair of the Texas Tech Rawls Dallas Scholarship event and is a member of the Rawls Advisory Council. King and his wife Ana Lucia have three children, J.S., Lui Girl, and DeLa. Dupree Scovell, the youngest, was a football letter winner at Texas Tech from 2000-2003. He earned four bachelor's degree from Texas Tech and two master's degree from Stanford, including a M.Ed. from the Stanford Graduate School of Education and an MBA from Stanford Graduate School of Business. Dupree spent five years working from Trammell Crow Company in Dallas and was named one of "Tomorrow's Newsmakers" by the National Real Estate Forum, "40 Under 40" by the Dallas Business Journal, and "Top 30 Real Estate Professionals Under 30" by Dallas CEO magazine. Dupree currently is the managing partner and chief investment officer at Woodbine Developme

NCAA Compliance 101

Recruiting Rules to Remember for Former Texas Tech Student-Athletes

Recruiting Basics

- A Prospective Student-Athlete (PSA) is a student who has started ninth grade and remains such until they attend classes or participate in official team practice at Texas Tech.
- All recruiting is done by designated Texas Tech head and assistant coaches.
- NCAA Rules preclude social media interactions, telephone and electronic communication and any interaction off TTU's campus.

Exception: A PSA's On-Campus Visit

• A former student-athlete MAY have on-campus contact with a PSA during the prospect's visit to campus.

After the Visit

- Additional contact with the PSA is not permitted.
- Once TexasTech.com officially announces the PSA's signing, you are permitted to have contact with the PSA. PSA's may not be provided with benefits at any time.
